We are pleased to announce that funding from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III has been made available to Dean College. The purpose is for Dean to provide emergency financial relief in the form of grants to students. These grants are being provided to assist with any component of a student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or childcare.

Each institution is given the authority to determine how best to distribute these funds to its students. Dean College will be allocating funds based on student's residency status and their financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- Full-time commuter students who filed a 2021-2022 FAFSA and qualified for need-based aid will receive between \$250 and \$1000.
- Full-time resident students who filed a 2021-2022 FAFSA and qualified for need-based aid will receive between \$250 and \$1500.

You will need to choose a payment method.

You may have the funds applied directly to your Dean College Student Account to assist with charges for the Fall 2021 semester or you may receive the funds electronically to your checking account through the Zelle digital payment network. Students who do not select a payment method will have their payment issued via the Zelle digital payment network. If a student does not register with Zelle, their payment will be issued via check later this summer. Dean College will not be able to make special arrangements for payments or process payments outside of these methods or schedule.

In the event additional relief opportunities become available, we will notify students promptly. Dean College is committed to doing all we can to support you during these unprecedented times.
