# Limits on the number of dance technique courses students can enroll in.

Starting this spring, there will be a limit on the number of dance technique (DAN) courses each student may register for during the initial registration period.

- DAN students (AA, BA, BFA) → 4 courses
- THA BFA (Acting & Musical Theatre) students → 2 courses
- THA BA students and DAN minors → 1 course
- All other Dean Students → 1 course

This process is being implemented to ensure:

- **Equity in access** allowing all students the opportunity to register for required & level-appropriate technique classes.
- **Student well-being** maintaining healthy, sustainable training loads that support your growth and safety.

If you wish to enroll in additional technique courses beyond the initial limit, you will need to schedule a brief meeting with **Professor Todd Shanks, Program Coordinator of Dance**, to discuss your request and the reasoning behind it. Exceptions may be granted based on program requirements, performance obligations, class availability or individual student goals.

# **HONORS COURSE OFFERINGS (COURSE DESCRIPTIONS)**

### HON 295 CAH1/HON-296-CAHH1/HON-298-CSH1/HON-399-H1 - Greece-Study-Travel Course (Honors) (3 cr)

**Instructor: Professor Rob Lawson** 

Meeting Days & Times: MWF, 10:00AM to 10:50AM

Greece-a, deeply historic society existing in a beautiful land and seascape. This course combines on-campus study with a 10-day trip to Greece in March 2026 (spring break). Students will create research projects that can include, but are not limited to, history, sociology, economics, art history, architecture, media, literature, music, theatre, dance, etc. In addition to the research projects, students will encounter curricula and logistical plans to prepare them for the travel experience. Prerequisite: Permission of the Instructor. There is a course fee (\$4950) which covers the costs of the tour and is bundled with the student's Spring 2026 tuition bill.

# HUM-296-CHH1- Iceland: Vikings and Volcanoes (Honors) (3 cr)

**Instructor: Professor Rob Lawson** 

Meeting Days & Times: MWF, 8:00AM to 8:50AM

Iceland: the land of ice and fire. Many know it as a film location for Game of Thrones or a place to see the northern lights on an Icelandair layover. This course goes deeper, giving students the opportunity to look at the nation of Iceland from 360 degrees, exploring history, geography, economics, literature, & culture, and more. Geologically, the island is not, old-volcanoes build new landscapes across Iceland even today-and humans have only inhabited Iceland for about a thousand years, starting with a few Irish monks and then the Vikings. But this relatively short geologic and human history has produced riches for us to discover, from glaciers fjords and lava fields to Norse sagas, Björk, and the meteoric Iceland national soccer team. Come on a journey to this beautiful island in the north Atlantic. Students taking this for Honors credit will be offered a fee-based (\$4950) short-term study-travel tour of Iceland at the conclusion of the semester. The course fee (\$4950) covers the costs of the tour and is bundled with the student's Spring 2026 tuition bill.

# SPECIAL TOPICS COURSE OFFERINGS (COURSE DESCRIPTIONS)

### BUS-394-0101 - MBTA Venture Challenge (3 cr)

Instructor: Professors Joe Fargnoli and Ursula Wefers Meeting Days & Times: MW, 11:00AM to 12:15PM

The Experiential Entrepreneurship: MBTA Venture Challenge is an innovative, *invitation-only* course that places students in the role of entrepreneurs evaluating real-world business opportunities. Students will research two MBTA Commuter Rail stations, Franklin and Forge Park/495, to determine which location offers greater potential for a new entrepreneurial venture. Through design thinking, market research, and financial analysis, students will identify opportunities that address commuter and community needs, select the stronger site, and develop a comprehensive start-up plan. Their work will culminate in a detailed plan, including market research, investment requirements, a marketing strategy, and a start-up budget.

### COM-390-01 - Iphone, Drones, GoPros (3 cr)

**Instructor: Professor Gregg Seibert** 

Meeting Days & Times: MW, 11:00AM to 12:15PM

This course is designed to engage students with practical application of new technologies used in video production. Students will engage using iPhones or Android phones, Drones and GoPros throughout the semester to do a series of weekly 1–2-minute projects that can be posted to their social media sites. At the end of the semester, all students will produce a 'teasers' project that will incorporate the best footage they have captured during the course. This project will synthesize the unique look and creative approach that these technologies can provide. Prerequisites: None.

### EXSC-290-01 - Move, Stretch & Relax (3 cr)

**Instructor: Professor Coleen Bartlett Taylor** 

Meeting Days & Times: MWF, 11:00AM to 11:50AM [Reserved for Sophomore and First-year Exercise Science Majors]

This course will explore the science behind the employment of movement and stretching to improve flexibility and range of motion, increase blood flow, improve posture, aid in injury prevention and relieve stress. Students will experience relevant movements and stretches, focusing on the skill of listening to their bodies. Students will also have the opportunity to research and experience concepts and techniques essential to the understanding of relaxation which is a state of physical and mental calmness, free from stress and tension, and crucial for overall well-being. Students will research and engage in activities that lower stress and activate the body's parasympathetic nervous system, providing benefits such as improved heart health, reduced anxiety, and better immune function. Common techniques explored include deep breathing, progressive muscle relaxation, body scam meditation, and engaging in hobbies to reduce tension and promote a sense of ease and flow. At the end of the semester, students facilitate a MOVE, STRETCH, and RELAX workshop for the campus community.

# THA-390-01 — Special Topics in Production and Design: Costume Construction (2 cr)

**Instructor: Professor Dustin Thomas** 

Meeting Days & Times: TTH, 9:30AM to 10:45AM

This course explores the basic concepts of costume design, patterning, and construction. Prerequisite: junior or senior standing. Prerequisite: Junior or senior standing. Course fee: \$50.

**Online Course Enrollment:** Dean College students may take online courses as part of their degree program. Students must have their advisor's approval to register for online courses. The following online course limits apply. Quarter courses are included in the full-term limits.

### For full-time students:

- First-year students may enroll in no more than one online course during the fall or spring semesters, not to exceed a total of 4 credits per semester.
- Sophomores, juniors, and seniors, except for students on an F-1 visa, may enroll in up to two online courses during fall or spring semesters, not to exceed a total of 8 credits per semester.
- Full-time students on an F-1 visa may enroll in no more than one online course during the fall, winter, spring, or summer terms, not to exceed a total of 4 credits in any single term.
- Full-time students may take no more than 50% of their total overall degree requirements as online courses.

### For part-time students:

Part-time students may enroll in one or more online courses, not to exceed a total of 11 credits in any single term.

Dean College partners with Rize Education to offer degrees in innovative, high-demand fields. Rize courses are built with industry experts and focus on real-world assignments, preparing students for careers in growing industries with above-average starting salaries. - **PBHL-121-RIZE:** History of Public Health: Explores the history, principles, and practices of public health, focusing on designing and implementing effective community health initiatives and understanding the role of international organizations. *Potential careers: Healthcare Administrator | Health and Safety Engineer | Environmental Specialist | Avg. Salary: \$76K-\$105K*

Note: Registration process is the same as for all other courses. Students would meet with their Success and Career advisor and add this course to their plan for the spring 2026 semester. All 4 courses are capped at 25 students.
