REGISTRATION DATES AND TIMES FOR SUMMER 2026

Dates students may begin to register for the summer are the same as the fall registration dates:

Registration times are based on completed credits plus current registered credits.

Summer courses are available for viewing and registration on the same timeline as courses for the fall semester. Students are required to work directly with their advisor regarding summer courses.

Registering & Paying for Summer Courses

- Students have access to view summer courses in Student Planning and the course booklet available on the Robbins Family Center for Advising & Career Planning department page on myDean.
- Students interested in taking a summer course should meet with their advisor during the regularly scheduled registration period to review options and plan their summer courses.
- When a student has decided to take a summer course(s), the advisor works with the student to complete the “Summer 2026 Student Registration” form.
- To be officially registered for a summer course, payment is required. The tuition for summer courses is \$430 per credit, plus a \$25 registration fee. Students are responsible for contacting Student Financial Planning to make payment. Once a student has paid their balance, they will be registered for their summer course(s) assuming space is available.

SPECIAL TOPICS COURSE OFFERING (COURSE DESCRIPTION)

ECO-290-OL1 – Economics of Mega Events (3 cr)

Instructor: Dr. Amy Crouch

Course Description: Explore the powerful intersection of mega events and economics through a central focus on the FIFA World Cup. This course examines how large-scale global events drive economic activity, influence government decision-making, and reshape local and international markets. Students will analyze revenue generation, job creation, and economic impact using real-world data and simplified economic models. Through case studies, students will critically evaluate both the short-term benefits and long-term consequences of hosting mega events, including issues of sustainability, infrastructure, and economic legacy.
